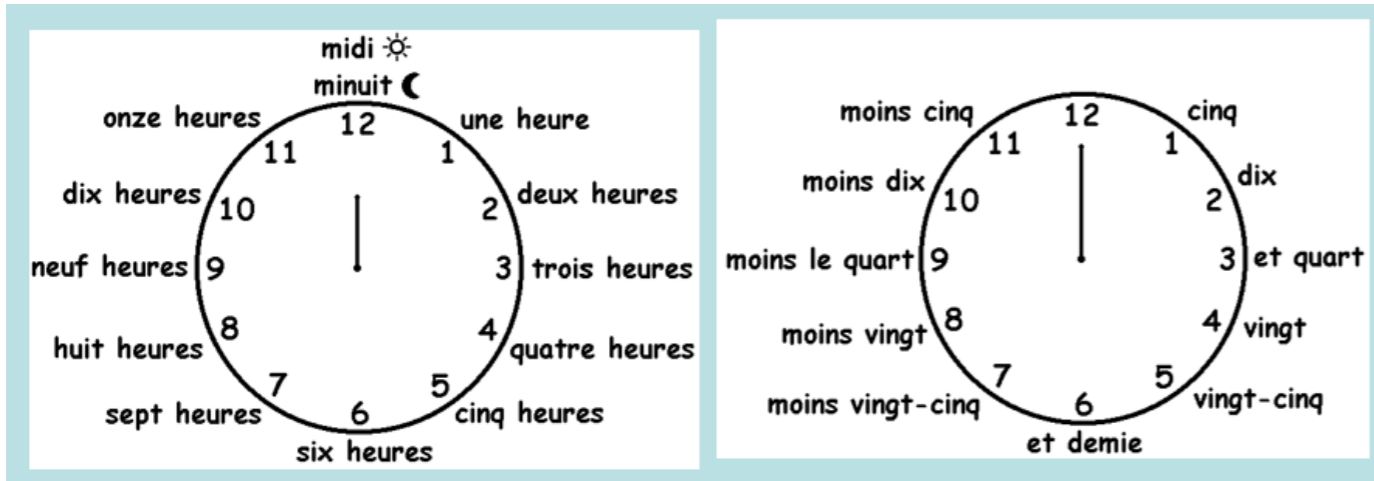


Telling the time

à + le = au
à + la = à la
à + les = aux

I prefer	Je préfère
I do / I am doing	Je fais
I think	Je pense

Using the negative
 In French we put 'ne' before the verb and 'pas' after the verb to say we don't do something.
 Je préfère = I prefer
 Je **ne** préfère **pas** = I do not prefer
